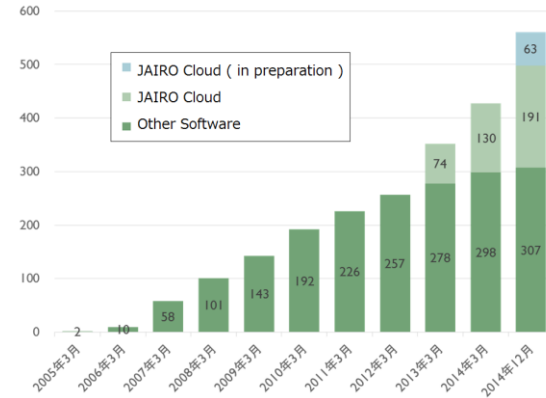


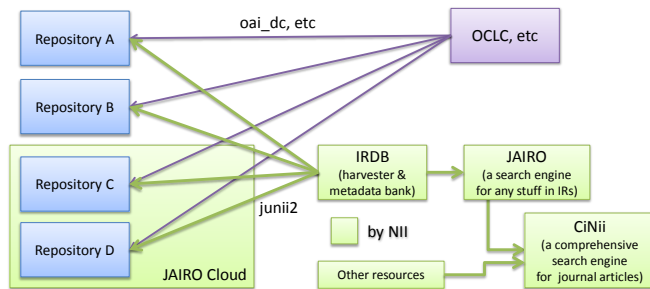

### # of Repositories



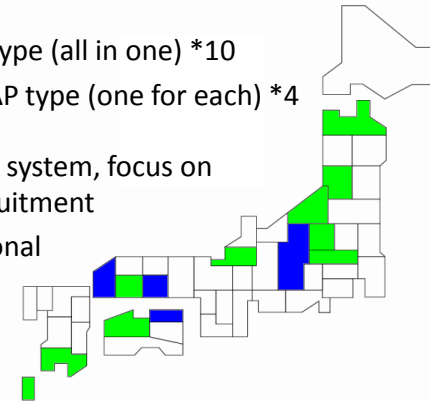
### OAI Networks

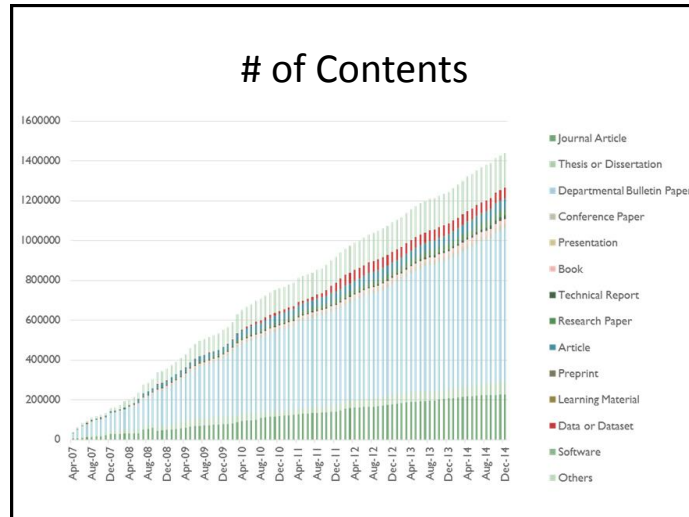


### Consortial repositories

- Whiterose type (all in one) \*10
- SHERPA-LEAP type (one for each) \*4

- Hands off the system, focus on contents recruitment
- Develop regional communities





### “KIYO” (Departmental Bulletin Papers)

- Journals published by universities
  - Edited by faculties / by departments / by laboratories
  - In Japanese / in English
  - Submission from inside / sometimes by students / globally
  - Light (or no) peer-review / strict peer-review
  - Highly rated in Humanities and Social Sciences / in STM
- Not commercially distributed, but by inter-university exchange
- As contents of a repository
  - Easy to negotiate
  - Easy to handle
  - Easy to digitize

### Repository managers

- Mostly librarian, caught up in a job rotation system
- Around 3 years in the position
  - Avg. 1 FTE \* 500 repositories in Japan
  - 170 new comers at the beginning of a year
- Hard to inherit experience and expertise

### Junii2 ver.3.1

- NII metadata element set (<http://irdb.nii.ac.jp/oai/junii2-3-1.xsd>)
  - Not an application profile of the Dublin Core, but inheriting many features from the DC
  - Original elements
    - NIIsubject/NIItype/NIIspatial/NIItemporal
    - NDC, NCID, NAID, ichushi, ...
    - grantid/dateofgranted/degreename/grantor

## e.g. NIItype

- Resource type vocabulary (14 terms)
  - To be dumbed down into DC.type

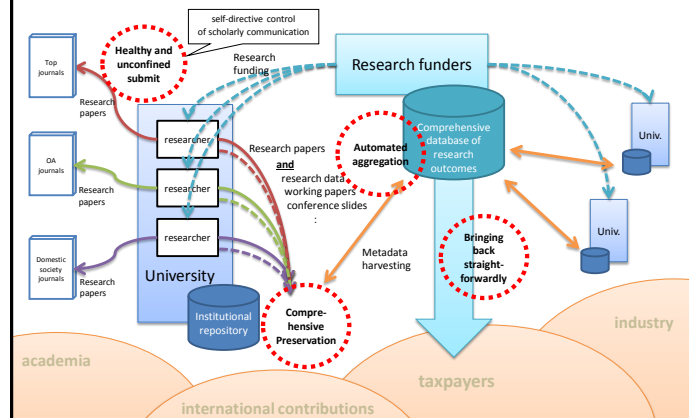

- 70% OA
